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#### **Overview**

Required - Applicants must be college students (at least sophomore status, 45 hrs completed at the time of application or two years post HS graduation) in good standing or a recent graduate with a minimum GPA of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale. Preferred – Some experience working with adolescents. Some prior exposure to Trio programs.
