Overview

The UMBC Upward Bound Math and Science Program is looking for qualified professional summer staff to work for the Summer Residential Program (SRP). Upward Bound Math and Science (UBMS) is a federally funded educational opportunity program that prepares high school students with academic potential and an interest in math and science to complete high school successfully and matriculate into a program of higher education. The program provides academic training, cultural enrichment, and professional development. During this experience students will take high school academic courses, tour college campuses, attend cultural events, and participate in regional activities. As a counselor for this summer experience, it is imperative to work with the students and other staff to ensure that this experience is successful overall.

Summer Responsibilities

UBMS is looking for counselors who can ensure the student's safety, help them remain focused on their responsibilities, and serve as a supervisor for any off campus activities. Counselors will also serve as role models, and are always expected to encourage the student's personal and professional development.

Tutor counselors will live in the residence hall, communicate and work with other UBMS staff, assist instructors in classes, coordinate study hall and tutoring activities, help students with homework, participate in a variety of activities with the students, monitor student's curfew, ensure that students are chaperoned at all times, and fulfill other duties and responsibilities as assigned.

Qualifications

Required - Applicants must be college students (at least sophomore status, 45 hrs completed at the time of application or two years post HS graduation) in good standing or a recent graduate with a minimum GPA of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale.

Preferred – Some experience working with adolescents. Some prior exposure to Trio programs.

Applications

Application packages should include the completed application, an unofficial transcript, a resume, and two letters of recommendation.
